1. President's note



Dear Media representatives!

With the qualification process complete we now know the 286 men and women who will be heading to Rio de Janeiro to try and earn themselves a precious Olympic medal.

For the vast majority of the millions of people watching on televisions all around the world, Olympic glory may well seem like an impossible dream, but for every single athlete that makes it to the podium of their chosen sport, their enormous achievement is the culmination of years of dedication. The Olympic Games is as much about inspiring the next generation of sports men and women to take up and enjoy competing as it is about showcasing the best of today's talent, and as we watch the pursuit of excellence we must remember what dedication can help us all to achieve.

At AIBA, we have taken great steps to ensure that this year's Olympic boxing competition is as fair, entertaining and inspiring as it possibly can be. Four years ago, women's boxing made its Olympic debut in spectacular style at London 2012 and in March of this year, in the light of exhaustive research by our medical team, the IOC agreed to AIBA's proposal that headguards be removed for the men's competition. Then, on 1 June in Lausanne, we held an Extraordinary Congress at which a change to the AIBA statute was overwhelmingly approved allowing pro-boxers from non-AIBA organisations to participate to our last Olympic Qualification Event.

This year we held four Continental Qualification Tournaments, a Women's World Championships, a World Olympic Qualification Event and a WPB/APB Qualification Tournament, and the results of those outstanding competitions are the 286 boxers now ready and waiting to go into the ring in Rio de Janeiro in pursuit of gold.

I would like to thank the Rio 2016 Organising Committee in delivering our outstanding venue at Pavilion 6 of Riocentro and congratulate all of the athletes that have made it to the Olympic Games. The very best of luck to you all.

2. Olympic Boxing History

One of the oldest recorded sports in the world, boxing was first incorporated into the Ancient Olympic Games in 688 BC, when Onomastros of Smyrna won the first ever boxing gold medal.

Just 18 athletes were competing when boxing was launched into the modern Olympic era at the third edition of the Games in St. Louis in 1904, but by the London Games four years later, that number had grown to 41, split across five weight categories.

By the Antwerp 1920 Olympic Games 116 competitors from 12 nations challenged for medals, with Africa winning its first boxing gold thanks to Clarence Walker. Eight years later in Amsterdam, for the first time national teams were limited to fielding one boxer per weight class.

Since then, Olympic boxing has evolved and developed, and created its very own icons like Laszlo Papp, the Hungarian southpaw who claimed three consecutive gold medals in 1948, 1952 and 1956.

Four years later in 1960 it was the turn of an 18 year-old by the name of Cassius Clay to write himself into history and begin a glittering career by taking the gold in Rome.

The first Asian gold medalist would be Japan's Takao Sakurai, who took the title on home soil at the Tokyo 1964 Games.

Four years on, a consistently devastating Cuban team first appeared on the scene, spearheaded by Teofilo Stevenson, who repeated Papp's feat of triple gold during the 1970s, and then by Felix Savon, who was crowned Olympic champion in 1992, 1996 and 2000.

Other legends of boxing including Joe Frazier, George Foreman, Ray Leonard and Oscar de la Hoya from the US, the Soviet Union's Valeriy Popenchenko and Danas Pozniakas, Yugoslavian Mate Parlov, Bulgarian Petar Lesov and Kenya's Robert Wangila all started long and glittering careers with an Olympic title.

Following a historic IOC meeting in August 2009, women's boxing became part of the official program of the Olympic Games for the first time at London 2012 competing across three weight categories with Nicola Adams (GBR), Katie Taylor (IRL) and Claressa Shields (USA) becoming the first gold medalists.

In Rio 2016 for the first time at an Olympics since LA 1984, the men will be boxing without headguards following exhaustive research by the AIBA Medical Commission into boxers' safety. It will also be the first Olympic Games with boxers from non AIBA ranks following decision by AIBA on June 1 2016

Pavillion 6 of the Riocentro exhibition centre in Rio's Barra da Tijuca district is the state-of-the-art arena set to host the world's top 286 men and women boxers as they battle for Olympic gold.

Boxing fans will be housed in the 7,225 square-metre sports complex with perfect, unobstructed views of the action from every seat.
