
INTRODUCTION


South East Asia







The ASBC General Assembly was held in the Grand Fourwings Hotel in Bangkok, Thailand where thirty-six delegations were present in the most important Asian meeting. The ASBC President and AIBA Vice-President Mr. Anas Alotaiba, AIBA Executive Director Mr. Tom Virgets, President of the Thailand Boxing Association Mr. Pichai Chunhavajira and ASBC Executive Director Mr. Ali Salameh led the ASBC General Assembly in Bangkok. The ASBC General Assembly took place before taking off the ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women Boxing Championship. The fruitful meeting delivered excellent unity of our continent in Bangkok. The approval of new amendments of the ASBC Constitution on the agenda of the ASBC General Assembly. According to the newly approved rules, the ASBC Executive Committee will consist of sixteen members. The ASBC Competition Calendar was also approved by the delegates which concluded five continental events in 2019 covering all age groups. Thailand, Kuwait, United Arab Emirates, Mongolia and Uzbekistan were to host ASBC major continental championships. Additionally, the ASBC Budget and the appointment of the External Auditor were approved.









Altogether thirty-six delegations had the voting rights in the ASBC General Assembly. In addition, two countries attended as observers. The five zones of the Asian Continent sent their delegations to the ASBC General Assembly where the highest participation figure has been recorded in the history of any meetings of the Asian Boxing Confederation. In accordance with the ASBC Constitution article 32.1/B, the Asian's AIBA EC members were automatically ASBC Executive Committee members. Those members are:

- Mr. Pichai Chunhavajira of Thailand
- Ms. Shelly Selowati H. Soejono of Indonesia and
- Mr. Yousuf Ali Al-Kazem of Qatar

The scrutineers were appointed before the commencement of the official elections as per both AIBA and ASBC rules. Two ASBC Vice-Presidents and nine ASBC Executive Committee members were elected by the voting delegations of the ASBC General Assembly by secret ballots in eleven rounds. Both Mr. Wu Di from China and Mr. Jae Joon Yoo from South Korea's were elected as new Vice-Presidents of the Asian Boxing Confederation. The newly elected members are representing each zone of the Asian Continent

At the technical level, ASBC conducted continental championships for all age categories that met the highest standards of transparency, integrity and ethical conduct, on a related level the organizational level was at the highest standard as well. At the Gender Equality level, ASBC conducted parallel championships for both men & women as the first time in the ASBC history. At long last ASBC Asian Schoolboy Boxing Championship has been organized in 2019 with exceptional success in the vision to engage the talented young athletes. At the technological side, the first mobile application was launched at the ASBC Asian Junior Boys & Girls Boxing Championships Fujairah – UAE, which contributed the information reaching smoothly, in addition to maintaining the environment. The fact that the athletes were the central concern of the development process, ASBC in partnership with host federations supported the participation of several teams in ASBC championships. Besides, the first-ever Asian Grand Slam Championship presented hand by hand with FCIT, ASBC partner; the championship was direct support to the athletes as our partner covered all the expenses (flight tickets, accommodation and prize money






The first event in 2019 was the ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women Boxing Championships, Bangkok-Thailand. At the very first time in the history of the elite events, both genders were attending at the same time in Thailand's capital which was scheduled to take place on April 16-27. The championship has held in ten women and ten men weight classes according to the AIBA Technical Rules. Boxers who were born between 1979 and 2000 were eligible to attend in the ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women Boxing Championships. The competition was held in the Huamark Indoor Stadium which had the capacity of 6,000 seats. The official accommodation place for the team delegations was the 4-stars Golden Tulip Sovereign Hotel which had the distance of 5.8km from the Huamark Indoor Stadium. The first historical edition of the Asian Boxing Championships started in Bangkok, Thailand in 1963. The metropolis also hosted the Asian continental event for the elite boxers in 1973, in 1985, in 1991, in 1992 and last time in 2015. Bangkok has got strong experiences hosting the highest level of international events. The Thailand Boxing Association welcomed the boxers in the 2017 and 2018 editions of the ASBC Asian Confederation Youth Boxing Championships. The last edition of ASBC Asian Elite Men & Women Boxing Championships took place in Tashkent, Uzbekistan 2017. Finally, the competition returned to Bangkok after four year











> ASIAN SCHOOLBOYS

The first historical edition of the ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships which is a great step forward in our road. Following our strategies have been fixed, ASBC strongly supported to launch this continental event for our 13 and 14-year-old hopes. The Kuwait sport was suspended in the recent years, but the country was planning to return to the boxing map, and ASBC decided to give them a perfect chance for the comeback hosting an ASBC Asian Championships in 2019. Kuwait Boxing Federation had the capability to host big events, and we were satisfied with their preparations and work during the championship. The post-Soviet countries arrived at the ASBC Asian Schoolboys Boxing Championships with strong teams as in all age groups, but many of the other nations have got potentials in this event. ASBC expected a high level of competition here in Kuwait City, but the quality of the boxers are amazed us and all officials. This age group is very important, and most of them started their international boxing career here in this event. We want to continue our new tradition in 2020 to arrange the 2nd edition for both genders. ASBC had high interest in this new event, out of the registered 25. Finally, 21 nations arrived with 150 young boy boxers to Kuwait City.



















> ASIAN JUNIOR

Following the Technical Meeting, the Official Draw was held in the ASBC Asian Junior Boys & Girls Boxing Championships in Fujairah at the Novotel Hotel. The Technical Delegate of Mr. Pat Fiacco led the Official Draw as well. The number of countries participating, achieved a record number of 26 Asian Nations. The championship which was the first-ever competition for the female juniors in the continent. A breaking number of boxers was recorded, as 239 altogether including 170 male and 69 female. The top boxing nations were Kazakhstan and India as they arrived with a maximum number of 26 boxers. Uzbekistan arrived with 23 boxers to the competition among the stars of our continent. Among developing Asian countries Afghanistan, Bahrain, Bhutan, Iraq, Nepal, Palestine, and Sri Lanka also sent boxers to the event to Fujairah as well.





















> ASIAN YOUTH

The official draw of the ASBC Asian Youth Men & Women Boxing Championships was held in the Bayangol Hotel following the Technical Meeting of the event. The number of the countries was 16 in the ASBC the championship in Ulaanbaatar. The number of the boxers was 180 and among them 113 male and 67 female athletes. The top boxing nations as Kazakhstan and India arrived with a maximum number of 20 boxers to the championship. Chinese Taipei arrived with a record number of 19 boxers to the new edition. Uzbekistan sent 18 boxers to this competition among the top nations, but China, South Korea, host Mongolia, Iran and Thailand also had big teams in the competition. From the developing Asian countries Iraq, Singapore and Sri Lanka also sent their boxers to the event in Ulaanbaatar. The boxers who were born between 2001 and 2002 were eligible to compete in such championship. Altogether 20 female and male champions were crowned in the ASBC Asian Youth Men, and Women Boxing Championships were 10 women and 10 men weight classes.












> ASIAN YOUTH







Following the four major ASBC Championships, a new event, The Asian Grand Slam, organized before the end of the year. The idea of the first-ever Asian Grand Slam arisen many years ago but the project is now realized with the support of the Asian Boxing Confederation and FCIT Company, the ASBC partner. The registration was opened in early November 2019 to all Asian National Federations for the Asian Grand Slam. The championship host city was in Xiamen, China during the period of December 18-22. Four boxers attend each weight class. Altogether 13 champions crowned in the event in 5 women weight classes and 8 men divisions which are the official Olympic categories. The first edition of the Asian Grand Slam is a money prize event; all the medalists have got payments during the competition in the city of Xiamen. FCIT covered all the accommodation, transportation and flight tickets for the team delegates. The first edition of the ASBC Asian Grand Slam Boxing Championships started with its first competition day in Xiamen which is located in the Fujian Province of the People's Republic of China. The Technical Meeting of the new event was held in Xiamen and it is confirmed that 27 selected top boxers to compete in China from eleven different countries from all regions of Asia. The President of the Asian Boxing Confederation, Mr. Anas Alotaiba of United Arab Emirates, arrived in the venue of competition to lead the Technical Meeting of the event together with the Technical Delegate of the historical championship, Mr. Ray Silvas of the United States. The Vice-President of the Asian Boxing Confederation Mr. Wu Di of China also welcomed all guests and participating teams in the Technical Meeting. The following 11 nations attended in the ASBC Asian Grand Slam Boxing Championships in Xiamen: Australia, India, Malaysia, Mongolia, Nepal, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Tajikistan, Chinese Taipei, and United Arab Emirates. One of the biggest names of the whole event was Chinese Taipei's Huang Hsiao Wen who claimed a gold medal in the last edition of the AIBA Women's World Boxing Championships in Ulan-Ude. Mongolia's Asian Games silver medalist Baatarsukh Chinzorig was one of the top stars of the men's part of the Grand Slam.

His biggest achievement as a boxer: Gold medal at the 1997 Mediterranean Games . His biggest achievement as a coach: Gold medals at the AIBA Women's World Boxing Championships, AIBA Women's Youth World Boxing Championships India topped the team rankings in the Guwahati 2017 AIBA Women's Youth World Boxing Championships where their head coach Italy's Mr. Raffaele Bergamasco led their squad. The Italian coach made strong successes with the elite team during the preparation events as in the Ahmet Comert Tournament in Turkey and in the Silesian Women's Open Tournament in Poland. His squad won four medals in the New Delhi 2018 AIBA Women's World Boxing Championships including one title which was achieved by legend Chungneijang Mary Kom Hmangte who became six-time AIBA World Champion this November.











Mr. Aslan Igubayev, Kazakhstan

His best achievement as a boxer: Kazakhstan National Champion, participant in the Budapest 1997 AIBA World Boxing Championships, His best achievement as an official: He worked as official in several ASBC Asian Confederation Boxing Championships. Kazakhstan is a traditionally strong boxing nation with several top results in the recent 25 years and their experienced official Mr. Aslan Igubayev is one of the hard working persons in the Asian continent who supports the success of our sport. Kazakhstan's tox Supervisor worked successfully in several big boxing events in 2018 and travelled a lot to cover all worldwide and multisport events with his great knowledges and experiences. Mr. Aslan Igubayev had a successful boxing career in the '90s before joining to the officials in Kazakhstan.













His best achievement as an official: He worked as official in the Youth Olympic Games, in the AIBA Youth World Boxing Championships and several ASBC Asian Confederation Boxing Championships Uzbekistan's ringside doctor Mr. Dilshod Kazakov ranked No.2 behind India's Mr. Lenny D'Gama in the Best of the Asians 2017 but following his hard work this year he took over his main rival. Mr. Dilshod Kazakov is an experienced International Technical Official who has been supporting the world's boxing life since decades. Mr. Kazakov worked successfully in the Budapest 2018 AIBA Youth World Boxing Championships and also in the Buenos Aires 2018 Youth Olympic Games.













Best achievements of the Uzbekistan Boxing Federation: 4 gold, 2 silver and 8 bronze medals in the Olympic Games (1996-2016), 6 gold, 13 silver and 17 bronze medals in the AIBA World Boxing Championships (1993- 2017). Uzbekistan was not only successful at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games but the country topped the team rankings in Brazil. Uzbekistan is one of the key nations not only in the Asian continent in our sport and their boxers worked strongly in the most important events in 2018. Uzbekistan won gold medals in the Buenos Aires 2018 Youth Olympic Games, in the Budapest 2018 AIBA Youth World Boxing Championships and in the Bangkok 2018 ASBCAsian Confederation Boxing Championships. Among the elite boxers Uzbekistan topped the team rankings in the Jakarta 2018 Asian Games with their five gold medals.
