ROBERTO CAMMARELLE



I was born in Milan on 30 July 1980 and I am a resident of Assisi (PG) at center of Italy. I am the second and last child of Angelo (father) and Giovanna (mather). I am married with Nicoletta and father of three children. I graduated in accounting in 1999 with 73/100. I have a knowledge of English and French both written and spoken.

Currently I am the Technical Director of the Boxing Sector of the Fiamme Oro, Sports Group of the State Police, I am Deputy Superintendent of Police, I was Team Manager of the Men's National Boxing Team (2015, 2019, 2020) and Member of the CONI Board (2017-2021).

I started learning boxing at the age of 11 at the Rocky Marciano gym in Cinisello Balsamo (Milan) where I was a resident. In 1995 I made my debut in the heavyweight category, up to 91 kg, winning the Italian title "Primi Pugni" after only three fights. Over the next four years I won all the heavyweight titles and became the holder of the junior national team and competing in the World Championships in 1998.

Since 2002, after two Elite Italian heavyweight titles, I have changed weight category becoming super heavyweight, over 91 kg. In June of the same year I had my first important achievement, silver at the Elite European Championships in Perm (Russia). Also from 2002 I became the captain of the Elite National team. I have participated in three Olympics and in 2008 I became Olympic Champion.

In my career I have won:

-9 Italian Elite titles;

-1 Olympic gold medal in Beijing 2008, 1 silver medal in London 2012 and 1 bronze medal in Athens 2004;

-2 world gold medals in Chicago (Usa) 2007 and Milan (Italy) 2009, 2 bronzes in Mianyang (China) 2005 and Almaty (Kazakhstan) 2013;

-3 gold medals at the Mediterranean Games in Almeria (Spain) 2005, Pescara (Italy) 2009 and Mersin (Turkey) 2013;

-3 European silver in Perm (Russia) 2002, Pola (Croatia) 2004 and Ankara (Turkey) 2011;

-4 gold medals to the European Community in Madrid (Spain) 2004, Cagliari (Italy) 2005, Pecs (Hungary) 2006 and Dublin (Ireland) 2007;

-1 gold at the 2004 Arizona (Usa) Military World Cup and 1 silver in Dublin (Ireland) 2002.

I made 230 matches, winning 206 and losing 24 matches.
