New Delhi , India has been selected as the host city to conduct the IBA Women's World Boxing Championships, 2023.

3. COVID-19 PROTOCOL

The event is approved as sporting event and IBA Event Management Protocol during COVID-19 pandemic will be implemented accordingly. The current Covid-19 situation is very dynamic, therefore, an update regarding all requirements and protocols will be provided if the situation changes.

At the moment, individuals will need to have their vaccination certificate to enter India. Non-vaccinated persons are requested to get a negative RT-PCR test conducted within 48 hours before arrival.

4. COMPETITION

a. Format

The Championships will be organised based on IBA Technical and Competition Rules.

• The twelve (12) IBA Elite Women's weight categories will be contested:

- The new IBA Bout Review Rule will be applied
- Rule 20 in the IBA Technical and Competition Rules will be followed
- Seeding will be applied based on IBA rankings
- Professional hand wraps will be used as per IBA Technical and Competition rules
- The Official Draw will be conducted by Sport Data through an electronic draw
- Two rings will be used until the Quarter-finals phase
- Medals will be distributed to the first 4 boxers of each weigh category (1 Gold, 1 Silver, 2 Bronze)
- The Technical Delegate of the event is to be decided
- The Event will be officiated by IBA International Technical Officials and IBA 3 Star-certified Referees and Judges, all appointed by IBA

b. Prize Money

The IBA Women's World Championships will have a prize money of USD 2.4 Million split across 12 weight classes and gold, silver and bronze medallists.

Medal	Prize Money
Gold	USD 100,000
Silver	USD 50,000
Bronze	USD 25,000
Bronze	USD 25,000

An athlete must win at least one bout in order to be eligible to earn the designated prize money. In the case that there is only one athlete present in a particular category, she will not be entitled to the prize money.

To avoid doubt:

- **a.** If the athlete has a win by Walkover (WO), and is a medallist, she will be entitled to receive the prize money.
- **b.** If the athlete has a loss and no wins, and is a medallist, she is not entitled to receive the prize money.

c. Sport Entries Check

The Sport Entries Check will take place on March 14 and 15, 2022. Teams will be informed of the exact date and time of their appointment during accreditation after arrival. Please make sure to arrive at New Delhi, India on or before March 13, 2022.

Each Team delegation can appoint a maximum of 2 persons to attend the Sport Entries Check. IBA recommends each team to send the Team Manager and/or the Team Doctor and/or the Head Coach.

Each Team Delegation's representatives will have a 10-minute appointment with IBA Officials to confirm the entry list of their delegation, the spelling of boxers' names, the uniforms, national flag and anthem and to present the official documents listed below to IBA. Your representative(s) must present:

- 1. Entry list of the delegation
- 2. Passport of each boxer
- 3. Record Book of each boxer
- 4. Boxers' uniform examples
- 5. Results of Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C and HIV tests, not older than 6 months
- 6. IBA Medical Certificates issued within the last 30 days for each boxer
- 7. Declaration of Non-pregnancy
- 8. IBA Fit to Box form
- 9. COVID-19 Declaration of No-symptoms Form signed by all team members
- 10. COVID-19 Liability Waiver Form signed by all team members
- 11. Anti-doping consent forms signed by each boxer
- 12. Video consent form signed by Team Manager/Head Coach
- 13. IBA General Participation Form
- 14. IBA Code of Conduct

6. REGISTRATIONS

a. Participating Boxers

AGE ELIGIBILITY: Boxers born from January 01, 1983 to December 31, 2004

Each National Federation is invited to register up to one (1) boxer in each weight category, as per IBA Technical and Competition Rules. All registrations need to be done through the IBA database (https://iba-database.sport/nf)

b. Team Officials

Each Team Delegation can have the following number of Team Officials:

- 1 Team Manager
- 1 Team Doctor
- 1 Physiotherapist
- 1 IBA-certified Team Cutman
- Number of coaches should be according to the table below:

> 1–3 Boxers: Up to 3 Coaches > 4–8 Boxers: Up to 6 Coaches > 9 – 12 Boxers: Up to 8 Coaches

c. Coaches

Each National Federation is invited to register up to one (1) boxer in each weight category, as per IBA Technical and Competition Rules. All registrations need to be done through the IBA database (https://iba-database.sport/nf)

- Only IBA-certified Coaches (1-star to 3-star) are allowed to work in the Field of Play (FOP)
- One of the 3 coaches can be replaced by an IBA-certified Team Cutman.

If your team does not have any IBA-certified coach (1, 2 or 3-star), please raise this at the Technical Meeting, so arrangements can be made with another team.



d. Extra Team Officials & National Federation Representatives

Extra Team Officials

Any individual that the National Federation (NF) would like to send to work along with the team in addition to the ones outlined in point 4.b., will be registered as an Extra Team Official.

Extra Team Official who does not have a direct link with the preparation of the team for the competition will not receive an accreditation.

- NF Representatives

Any individual attending the event as a representative of the NF, such as:

Each National Federation can register up to a total of 6 additional persons within the 2 categories named above.

All Extra Team Officials and National Federation Representatives' registrations must be done through the IBA database in the dedicated section of the event.

In the event when one of the representatives has special security needs (personal security), please make sure that you contact the LOC at loc2023@boxingfederation.in to arrange access, accreditation and entry into India in accordance with local authorities.

Important: If you plan to bring more than 6 additional persons, please note that accreditations will not be provided.

12. TECHNICAL VIDEO RECORDING

Each National Federation will be allowed to record the bout of their boxers with up to one camera per ring. Two specific locations in the stands will be reserved for these technical areas. Recordings are for technical purposes only and not for public broadcasting, social media included. The access to the two technical video recording areas will be conditioned to the signature of a disclaimer in this regard. You will find it attached at the end of this Handbook. The Team Manager of each National Federation must bring the signed copy to the Sport Entries Check.

13. IMAGE RIGHTS

IBA has appointed an IBA photographer to promote the image of boxers during the World Championships. By participating in the Championships, each Boxer agrees to release their image rights to IBA for promotional purposes.

14. DOPING CONTROL

Anti-doping controls will be conducted in accordance with the IBA Anti-Doping Rules and the World Anti-Doping Code. We want to remind you that according to WADA regulations, from 2016, blood testing may be conducted during IBA Competitions.

TUE must be submitted through the ADAMS system no later than the February 13, 2023 (23:59 GMT).

15. MEDICAL CARE

The LOC will provide medical care and first-aid during the entire Championship Period to any participant who suffers from a sports injury sustained during the Championship.

16. INSURANCE

All participants are requested to get their own travel and medical insurance as the LOC will provide liability insurance for all participants only at the Competition Venue.

17. AWARDS

Several awards, including the Best Boxer Trophy of the IBA Women's World Boxing Championship, New Delhi, 2023 will be distributed after the last finals ceremony.




18. HOST CITY – NEW DELHI, INDIA



Built with pink stone and white marble, the temple complex comprises a sprawling garden, sculptures, water show as well as a boat ride. If you are visiting Delhi, exploring the beautiful monuments in the capital city should be on your itinerary too. Majestic forts, monuments and mosques have a very special place in the heart of the city.




At the centre of the Mughal Sultanate, the **Red Fort or Lal Quila** stands unique with its thick red sandstone walls. Emperor Shah Jahan is behind this grand historical monument of India.





Jama Masjid near Red Fort is one of the largest mosques in India. Popular as Shah Jahan's last architectural extravagance, the mosque took its final shape in the year 1656. Interestingly, its inner courtyard can hold an incredible 25,000 individuals at a time.



The **Lotus Temple** is a Bahá'í House of Worship that was dedicated in December 1986. Notable for its flowerlike shape, it has become a prominent attraction in the city. Like all other Bahá'í Houses of Worship, the Lotus Temple is open to all, regardless of religion or any other qualification.



The historical capital city, Delhi is a foodies' paradise. From street food to international cuisines, it is also one of the only places in India to offer a wide variety of street food options.
